20 YEARS OF BUILDING HOPE & HONORING HEROES

Twenty years ago, Dan Wallrath heard about a young Marine from Friendswood, Texas, who'd been seriously injured by an IED while serving in Iraq. The Marine's family was doing their best to bring him home, but their house needed extensive modifications to make that possible.

Wallrath, then president of the Bay Area

Builders Association, knew he had to do something to help. Fueled by a passion to help, he spearheaded a grassroots effort, eventually called Bay Area Builders Association Support Our Troops, to unite industry experts around the goal.

We didn't know it then, but it was the start of Operation Finally Home.

Now, 20 years later, that grassroots effort has grown into a national nonprofit providing mortgage-free homes, home modifications and transitional housing for veterans, first responders and their surviving spouses.

"In the past 20 years, our organization has grown far beyond anything I could have imagined back then," Wallrath said. "This

anniversary is something I couldn't even dream of back then, but I am so proud of the work Operation Finally Home has achieved over the past 20 years and the powerful ways we'll continue to honor America's heroes in the future."

While the nonprofit has grown since that day in 2005, Operation Finally Home's mission has remained the same. Now active in 34 states, Operation Finally Home has averaged one new home a month over the past 20 years and completed more than 200 home modifications. Through a partnership with five schools in the Humble and Huntsville (Texas) Independent School Districts, we've completed more than 25 tiny homes that serve as transitional housing for homeless veterans.

We're proud of these milestones and the difference these achievements have made in the lives of America's heroes and their families—but the work continues. While we celebrate the past, we're also looking ahead to the future. Our goal is to complete 100 projects by the end of 2026, and we can't do it without the support of our partners, supporters and donors.

But as we move forward, we're staying focused on the goal that started this mission: bringing together passionate people—builders, contractors, suppliers, donors and volunteers—who are willing to give back to those who've already given so much.



A FEW WORDS FROM DAN

As I look back over the years, it's hard to believe that Operation Finally Home is celebrating its 20th anniversary. What began as a single remodel for a wounded Marine in 2005 has grown into a national movement, making a difference in the lives of veterans, first responders and their families across the country.

I am so honored to be a part of the work we doand none of this would be possible without the support of our partners, builders, suppliers and donors. Your generosity helps us fulfill our mission to provide America's heroes with a safe place to call home.

We've had a lot to celebrate over the past two decades-more than 500 home projects completed or planned in more than 30 states, including 40-plus transitional housing projects and over 240 home modifications. As our mission has evolved, so has our work. While new construction will always be a part of our story, we've come to recognize that sometimes what makes the greatest difference isn't building a new house, but modifying an existing one to fit the unique circumstances of a recipient.

Home modifications allow us to meet families where they are-whether that means widening hallways for a wheelchair, reworking a bathroom to be accessible or adding features that make everyday living safer. These projects may not always carry the excitement of a ground-up build, but for the families who benefit, the impact is just as profound.

As we step into this next chapter, our commitment remains the same: to honor heroes with homes. Thanks to your continued support, we're able to broaden our reach and respond with flexibility and compassion.

Twenty years is a milestone worth celebrating, but it's also a reminder that our work is not finished. Together, we can continue to change lives—one family, one home, one modification at a time.

2016: Operation Finally Home completes 100th home. U.S. Marine Corps Cpl. Jonathan Dowdell and his family received the keys to their home in League City, Texas, in April 2016.



2016: Dan Wallrath published his book, Building Hope: What Happens When God Changes Our Plans to Accomplish His.

2021: 194 home projects and 75 home modifications completed since 2005, with 118 projects in the planning stages and 32 states represented.




2024: 546 projects completed or in the planning stage (since 2005), including more than 244 home modifications and 40-plus transitional homes.
















BACK-TO-SCHOOL






